


WHEREAS, we enjoyed a night at the visually overwhelming La Nouba Cirque du Soleil performance; and

WHEREAS, she then served with distinction as Disciplinary Counsel to the New Hampshire Supreme Court's Committee on Professional Conduct; and


WHEREAS, she has been selected as the next United States Magistrate Judge for the District of New Hampshire; and







WHEREAS, Steve was taken from us quite suddenly in December of 2009, barely eighteen months after retirement; and,


